Apply Online for Your Burn Permit

With Spring comes the itch to clean your yard and get rid of leaves and brush from last year. We want you to be able to enjoy your outdoor spaces this Spring and Summer, but if you decide to burn your yard waste then you require a burn permit.

The Township of North Glengarry requires burn permits for any resident who wants to have an open-air fire (bonfire, fire pit etc.). Only residents living in approved areas can obtain a permit. Permits are conditional and may be revoked at any time.

The process to apply is quite simple; visit <https://northglengarry.burnpermits.com/> to either create an account or login. From there follow the instructions and soon you'll have your burn permit. Please follow any updates posted in regards to burn bans on the North Glengarry Fire Services Facebook Page.

What are you allowed to burn? Please only burn wood, wood-by-products (cardboard etc.) or leaves. Please use caution when burning, ensure you have enough water on hand to adequately contain the fire at the fire site.

Please note that barbecues, natural gas, propane, or oil outdoor fireplaces do not require a permit.

The property tax cycle is from January to December. Two tax bills are issued each year. The interim taxes are due on the last working day of February and April. Final taxes are due on the last working day of July and September.

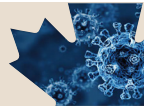

Turn off tap using paper towel.

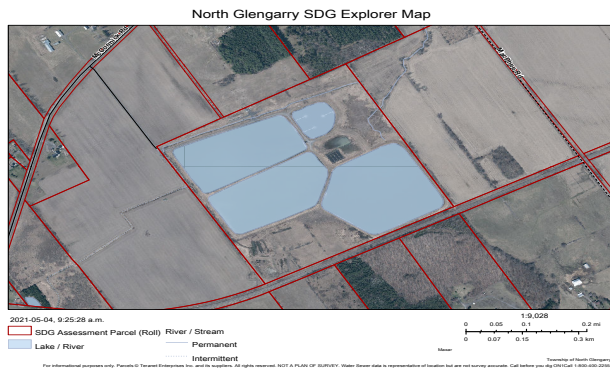


If soap and water aren't available, use a hand sanitizer containing at least 60% alcohol. Rub your hands together (as shown in Step 3) until dry.

Council highlights

Council Commits to Completing Alexandria Sewage Lagoon Treatment Project



On April 26, 2021 Council voted unanimously to immediately issue a Request for Proposal for consulting engineering services for contract administration and project management, and authorized staff to approve connection to the Alexandria wastewater collection system.

For the past 30 years, the Town of Alexandria has been under a growth freeze due to insufficient lagoon capacity as the lagoon requires an upgrade to comply with Federal and Provincial effluence standards and improve treatment capabilities and efficiencies.

The project is expected to be completed within a period of 5 years. Council had identified the lagoon as a major priority in the 2019 Strategic Plan. The total cost of the project is setimated to be \$19 million. Upon completion the lagoon capacity will be doubled, and the effluent standards will be met.

Glengarry Sports Palace Receives Grant to Assist with Refurbishment

North Glengarry received \$863,550 in Federal Funding, \$719,553 in Provincial Funding, and \$575,772 in Municipal Funding for the refurbishment of the Glengarry Sports Palace to replace the arena slab and address accessibility and energy efficiency issues.

The Government of Ontario is investing more than \$2.3 million in six local recreational infrastructure projects through the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program.

North Glengarry Community Improvement Plan (C.I.P.)



A C.I.P. provides a tool through which the municipality will be able to direct funds, implement policy initiatives, and stimulate private sector investment. All commercial properties are now eligible to apply for the program. Residential properties listed on the Municipal Heritage Register are also eligible;

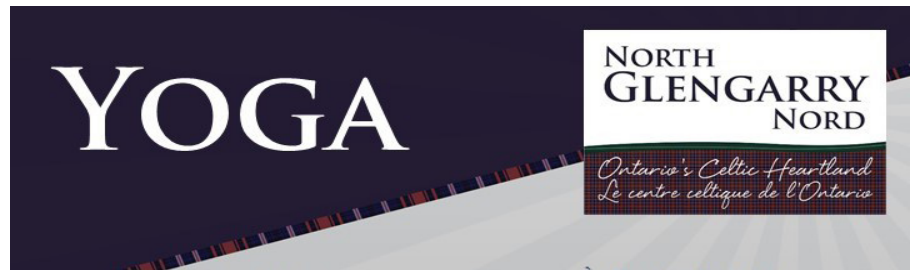

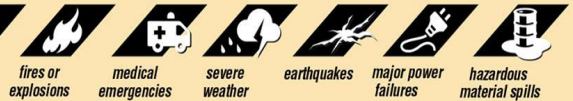
Don't forget to register your dog

Common types of emergencies



An emergency poses an immediate risk of significant harm to health, life, property or the environment. Preparing for emergencies is an important part of your workplace health and safety program and is a legal requirement throughout Canada.

4 elements of an emergency management program



What's in a written emergency response plan ?

- ✓ Scope and outline potential emergencies
- ✓ Alarms and other methods of initiating a response
- ✓ Site-specific response procedures
- ✓ Command structure, roles and responsibilities
- ✓ Shutting down of power
- ✓ Evacuation and assembly procedures
- ✓ Communication systems and protocols
- ✓ Emergency contact lists
- ✓ Resource lists

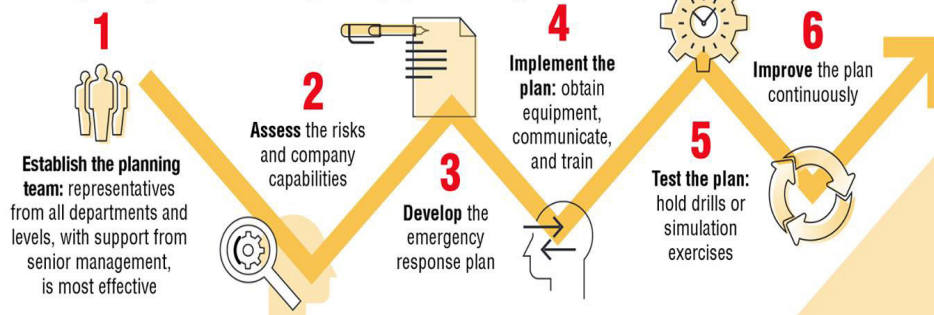
- Keep employees and responders free from harm
- Manage life-threatening situations
- Minimize damage to the environment, equipment, machinery, tools, etc.
- Minimize downtime

Why prepare for emergencies?

As a worker, it is important that you know how to

- Identify common types of emergencies
- Respond if you encounter a situation
- Respond when an emergency alarm is activated
- Ask your employer for more information and training
