Proposed Zoning Amendments Approved

Council approved three proposed zoning amendments:

One application to rezone the subject lands from Residential First Density to Residential Second Density to permit the construction of a semi-detached dwelling on the subject lands.

Two applications to sever land deemed surplus to the needs of the farming operation and to re-zone both the severed and retained portion.

The building is the long-time home of Muir's Bakery along with one residential apartment on the second floor. This project will consist of the installation of new windows, door replacement, and a new awning to display Muir's Bakery signage.



Ontario Investing in Local Emergency Preparedness and Response in Glengarry

The Ontario government is investing \$50,000 in North Glengarry through the Community Emergency Preparedness Grant designed to help communities purchase critical supplies, equipment and deliver training and services for emergency management.

"As the MPP of Glengarry-Prescott-Russell, I am pleased to see the allocation of this \$50,000 grant towards bolstering emergency preparedness initiatives in Ontario. This funding will not only enhance our region's resilience but also contribute to the safety and well-being of our communities," said MPP Stéphane Sarrazin

"Through the Community Emergency Preparedness Grant, our government is stepping up to ensure Ontario is safe, practiced and prepared for any type of emergency," said Caroline Mulroney, President of the Treasury Board and Minister responsible for Emergency Management. "From floods to wildland fires, these targeted investments will empower communities and organizations to enhance their emergency response. Whether it's building up local fire departments or enabling more efficient search and rescue operations, our government is giving communities the tools and resources they need to keep people safe."



Ontario government grant will allow for a new generator at the Glengarry Sports Palace as part of the Township's emergency preparedness plan.

"Recently, the Township of North Glengarry has seen a sharp increase in weather-related events that have affected the utilities in the municipality. The amount of \$50,000, received through the Community Emergency Preparedness Grant from the Province of Ontario, will fund in part the installation of a natural gas generator at the Glengarry Sports Palace in Alexandria. During future emergencies, the facility will be a safe place for members of the community to recharge their phones or battery-operated medical equipment, keep warm or cool, access food preparation spaces, bathrooms, and take showers, no matter the length of the incident. " said Jamie MacDonald, mayor of the Township of North Glengarry.

Weed harvesting to begin mid-June at Mill **Pond**

The summer weather is finally here, bringing with it the return of flip flops, shorts and Canada waterweed (Elodea canadensis).

The Township of North Glengarry recognizes that while the water lilies in Mill Pond are pretty when they're blooming, the algae and Canada waterweed create less than ideal swimming conditions. Similar to previous years the Township is committed to a collaborative strategy with Raisin River Conservation Authority and the Department of Fisheries and Oceans to reduce this invasive perennial over a limited area equal to 9.1% of Mill Pond.

The removal of the weeds from Mill Pond is scheduled to start after June 17th and it improves the fish habitat by promoting an increase of dissolved oxygen for aquatic life. The harvester cuts weeds, collects them on its deck and they are deposited on the shore where they are relocated for composting.

The Canada waterweed is an invasive and adaptable perennial plant that thrives in both moving and still water. It usually grows horizontally, forming a dense carpet of weeds. Although it sometimes reaches the water surface, this nuisance plant usually maintains stems and leaves that are completely submerged. The plant anchors itself to the bottom by means of roots that develop along the stem and the stolon of the plant, reaching an average length of around one metre. Controlling these weeds involves mechanically removing them from the water and composting the plants on land
