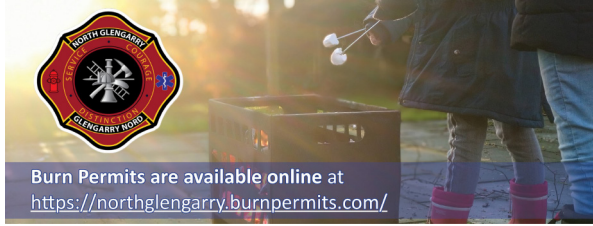

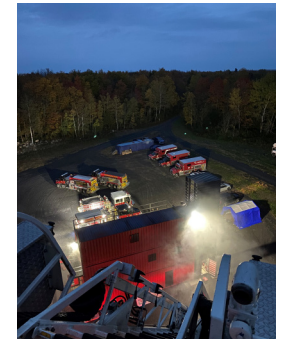

FIRE PREVENTION

The **easiest** (and probably the **loudest**) test you'll ever do.



Test your smoke alarms every month. #GetLoud 



Fire and smoke spread so quickly, the fire department may not arrive in time to save you in a fire.

When the smoke alarms sound, get out immediately and call 9-1-1 from outside. **Never** re-enter a burning building.

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

Make your own basic emergency kit

In an emergency, you could be without power, water or transportation. Make sure you have an emergency kit with basic supplies for at least 72 hours.

What to include

-  Water
At least 2 litres per person, per day
-  Food that won't spoil
-  Manual can opener
-  Flashlight
(pack extra batteries)
-  Battery powered radio
(pack extra batteries)
-  First aid kit
-  Extra keys for your car and house
-  Cash in smaller amounts
-  A copy of your emergency plan and contact information
