Re: Capital Budget Item - Snowflakes

#### BACKGROUND

Council approved a capital expenditure of \$15,000 in the 2016 Economic Development Capital Budget to produce LED snowflakes for the Township of North Glengarry. A local artisan, Mr. Alain Belanger, was employed to create the LED snowflakes at the quoted cost of \$500 each for a total of 30 LED snowflakes. 19 LED snowflakes were produced and installed on the 19 electrified poles in the Alexandria core at the start of the 2016 Holiday season. The balance of the snowflakes produced were stored in the Public Works building on Lochiel.

In December 2016, the artisan advised staff that he had underestimated the cost of materials and that we should expect an increase in the costs moving forward. Mr. Belanger sent out a request for quotes for the materials and has quoted a cost of \$600 per snowflake.

When looking at comparables to purchase similar snowflakes from commercial-grade lighting suppliers, the costs vary between \$750 US to \$800 US plus shipping depending on the quantity (and quality) purchased.

During the 2017 budget exercise Council approved a Capital Budget of \$15,000 to produce additional snowflakes for the hamlets. An additional sum of \$5,000 was set aside to electrify poles in the hamlets. This type of request must go through Ontario Hyrdro and the process to obtain permission took nearly one year. Due to the length in time to obtain approval to proceed with the work, a decision was made to electrify 41 poles in Apple Hill, Glen Robertson, Dalkeith, and Dunvegan for which the total cost was \$8919 which is a cost overrun of \$3919. We now have 60 electrified poles including the ones in Alexandria.

This year, the artisan had material left from the 2016 production to 2 snowflakes at the 2016 price of \$500. With \$14,000 remaining only 23 snowflakes will be produced in addition to those

two. In all, at the end of 2017, we will have 55 snowflakes and be short 5 snowflakes to cover the 41 electrified posts in the hamlets.

In an effort to complete this project in 2017, we are requesting a Capital pre-approval of \$3,000 to be included as part of the 2018 Economic Development Capital Budget requests to produce the shortfall of 5 units.

#### FINANCIAL DETAILS

\$3,000 added as a pre-approved capital expenditure in the 2018 Economic Development Capital Budget.

#### RECOMMENDATION:

### Discussion:

Mr Eddie Kyer is looking to install an outdoor wood stove on his property at 18925 Concession 5 Road. The proposed woodstove is required to be setback 46 meters from all property lines as per **Outdoor Wood Burning Appliance By-Law 04-2010**. Mr. Kyer is looking for relief of the required 46 meters to a proposed 22 meters as he has safety concerns in regards to the stove's placement in the centre of his yard.

The application for Minor Variance submitted by Mr. Kyer could not be reviewed under the scope of the *Planning Act R.S.O. 1990*. The Minor Variance process applies only to by-laws under the power of the *Planning Act*, such as the Township of North Glengarry's Zoning By-Law.

Mr. Kyer is looking for a "variance" or an exemption from the **Outdoor Wood Burning Appliance By-Law 04-2010**, which is a by-law that was passed under the *Municipal Act S.O.* 2001.

After reviewing the Outdoor Wood Burning Appliance By-Law, it would appear that it was founded in the *Municipal Act*'s section on Health, Safety and Nuisance:

- a local municipality may prohibit and regulate with respect to <u>public nuisances</u>, including matters that, in the opinion of council, are or could become or cause public nuisances;
- a local municipality may prohibit and regulate with respect to noise, vibration, <u>odor</u>, <u>dust</u> and <u>outdoor illumination</u>;

### Recommendation:

That the Council of North Glengarry Township accepts the formal request for a variance to our Outdoor Wood Burning Appliance By-Law 04-2010 and to approve the proposed location of the woodstove 22 meters from Mr. Kyers' property line.

### BY-LAW 41-2017 FOR THE YEAR 2017

BEING A BY-LAW TO ADOPT, CONFIRM AND RATIFY MATTERS DEALT WITH BY RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS s. 5(3) of the *Municipal Act*, 2001, provides that the powers of municipal corporation are to be exercised by its Council by by-law; and

**WHEREAS** it is deemed expedient that the proceedings, decisions and votes of the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Glengarry at this meeting be confirmed and adopted by bylaw;

**THEREFORE** the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Glengarry enacts as follows:

- 1. **THAT** the action of the Council at its regular meeting of September 25, 2017 in respect to each motion passed and taken by the Council at its meetings, is hereby adopted, ratified and confirmed, as if each resolution or other action was adopted, ratified and confirmed by its separate by-law; and;
- 2. THAT the Mayor and the proper officers of the Township of North Glengarry are hereby authorized and directed to do all things necessary to give effect to the said action, or to obtain approvals where required, and except where otherwise provided, The Mayor and the Clerk are hereby directed to execute all documents necessary in that behalf and to affix the corporate seal of the Township to all such documents.
- 3. **THAT** if due to the inclusion of a particular resolution or resolutions this By-law would be deemed invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction then Section 1 to this By-law shall be deemed to apply to all motions passed except those that would make this By-law invalid.
- 4. **THAT** where a "Confirming By-law" conflicts with other by-laws the other by-laws shall take precedence. Where a "Confirming By-Law" conflicts with another "Confirming By-law" the most recent by-law shall take precedence.
