# Council highlights

## Province Launches New Modern Ontario Business Registry



Ontario is launching a new Ontario Business Registry on October 19, making it easier, simpler, and more affordable for millions of businesses and not-for-profit corporations to interact with the government. The new online registry will replace out-dated technology, providing people across the province with direct access to government services 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.

Businesses will now be able to complete over 90 transactions through the new online registry, including registering a new business and dissolving an existing one. Registrations or filings that were previously submitted by mail or fax, taking four to six weeks to complete, can now be done instantly through the online registry.

## Digital Main Street is Back

Digital Main Streets Digital Transformation Grants are available until October 31, 2021.

The grant provides brick-and-mortar businesses with \$2,500 to support the adoption of digital technologies.

The funds can be used for (amongst others) the redesign of existing websites or develop a new one, purchasing new graphic design software or hardware, and digital training courses.

A C.I.P. provides a tool through which the municipality will be able to direct funds, implement policy initiatives, and stimulate private sector investment. The new Small Business Health and Safety Training Program will improve health and safety awareness to help prevent illness and injuries by training health and safety representatives of small businesses on how to keep workers safe in retail, construction, health care, accommodation, and food services as well as many other sectors. Businesses will also be reimbursed for the time the representatives are away from work.

## New Funding Intake for Food and Beverage Processors

Canada and Ontario are investing up to \$6 million in projects to help Ontario food and beverage processors improve their operations, increase their competitive edge and adapt to challenges as the pandemic begins to subside.

Applications for this program will be accepted in two phases.

The first phase of this new intake under the Canadian Agricultural Partnership to support projects that will be accepted. Applications for phase one of the intake will be accepted starting on August 5, 2021 until September 2, 2021.

The second phase of the intake will open in September for targeted projects to improve labour productivity, efficiency and reduce waste.

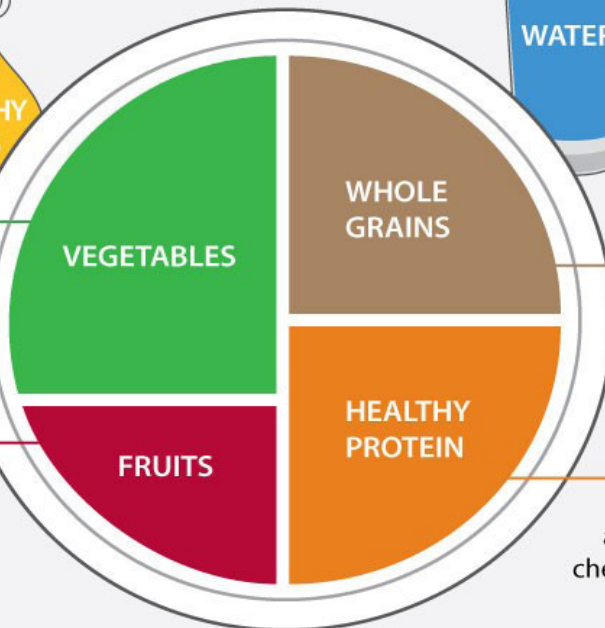

## HEALTHY EATING PLATE

Use healthy oils (like olive and canola oil) for cooking, on salad, and at the table. Limit butter. Avoid trans fat.



The more veggies—and the greater the variety—the better. Potatoes and french fries don't count.

Drink water, tea, or coffee (with little or no sugar). Limit milk/dairy (1-2 servings/day) and juice (1 small glass/day). Avoid sugary drinks.

Eat a variety whole grains (like whole-wheat bread, whole-grain pasta, and brown rice). Limit refined grains (like white rice and white bread).

Choose fish, poultry, beans, and nuts; limit red meat and cheese; avoid bacon, cold cuts, and other processed meats.
